There have been made demonstrations of such in our own community, with strangers helping strangers, new friendships forged, and a desire to help one another through touch times. The Council, alongside its community partner, Upton Together, has received so much kind feedback, and especially important to us, is a recognition of an increase in positive community spirit.

Let us hope that the COVID legacy for us is that it brought our community together in ways we had only dreamt were possible, and our mission is now to keep that sense of togetherness going.

Work to improve our town continues, with the Council pledging funds to continue the Speed Indicator Device programme, which the Dorset Council are withdrawing. We aim to expand on the existing sites to offer this important community safety messaging device to help keep our residents safe.

Members have also approved the installation of some bollards in Dacombe Close to prevent the abuse of the green open space by vehicles travelling across them. Residents have become increasingly concerned about safety in this area, and councillors have listened and acted.

We hope you enjoy our Christmas displays—we are especially proud of our Santa reinforcing the social distancing message! Thanks to the dedicated team of volunteers; without their help these displays would not be possible.

Our eleven dedicated council members work hard, often in the background, lobbying hard to address local issues. There are many unseen meetings and site visits to highlight issues with speed limits, parking issues and anti social behaviour. We will continue to press hard on all issues that we know are important to our community.
