Dorset County Council is the responsible authority for maintenance of roads and pavements, and part of their duties has been the routine weed killing in the roadside gullies. We have been advised that due to essential budget cuts of £3 million no routine weed killing will be undertaken by DCC this year throughout Dorset.

It is therefore pleasing to be able to advise our residents that this Council will undertake this service and our operative is scheduled to receive training and become certified shortly. This forms part of the enhanced street cleansing service we are able to offer our residents to keep our environment looking good.
