

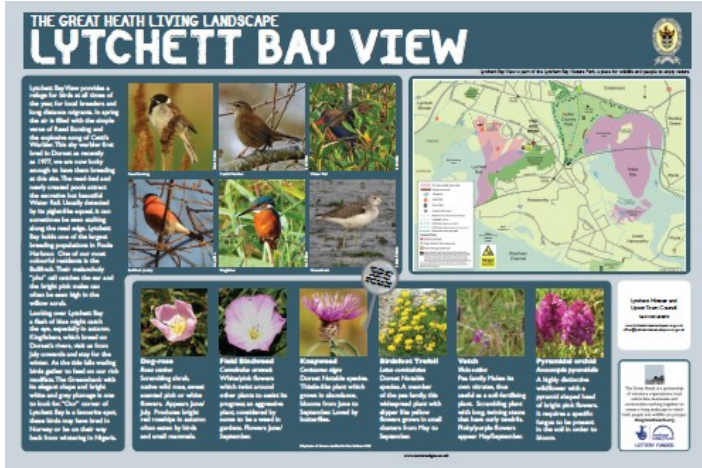

YOU COULD HELP SAVE A LIFE—VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED

Did you know that when someone suffers a cardiac arrest, the heart stops, blood is no longer pumped around the body and they are clinically dead. The longer they go without emergency life-support, the harder it is to restart the heart. That's where you can make a difference.

A defibrillator is a machine used to give an electric shock to restart a patient's heart when in cardiac arrest. It is proposed to site such a machine in Lytchett Minster for use at all times, supported by people who will know how to use it. We are seeking to create a register of volunteers who would be willing to attend an awareness session that will provide an opportunity to get answers to any questions you may have and dispel any mystery about the device. No specialist knowledge is required and demonstration defibrillators will be used, so you can see how to operate them and what they can do. This life saving skill may be used for the benefit of your own community or elsewhere, as defibrillators are sited nationwide.
