Help for Better Recycling

Don't believe anything you hear and only half of what you see.

A national newspaper recently cited a situation where two thirds of recyclable plastic food containers are burnt or sent to landfill in Poland – that is not happening with our plastics in Dorset. We use a sophisticated Materials Recycling Facility, which allows us to recycle 59% of our total waste and below are some things we can do better.

Recycle any paper except paper which is plasticised, foiled or heavily glittered.

Recycle all of your plastic food tubs and containers, with plastic lids fitted if possible although loose lids are OK, but please not plastic garden pots.

Please continue to recycle even your black plastic food pots and tubs, which do have to be burnt at the moment, but in a small so-phisticated incinerator that produces heat and electricity. This is still far better than putting them into landfill.

It is better to wash your pots and containers using your washing up water, but dirty containers are acceptable providing there are no large amounts of food stuck to the container.

Please if possible flatten your plastic drinks bottles and fit the lids to stop the bottles expanding again, but loose plastic lids are OK.

For glass bottles and jars please put the metal lids on them because the metal will be recycled.

Please do not include thin plastic film, like plastic bags, or film attached to plastic trays.

If you can do these things we expect Dorset to achieve our 60% recycling target.
