Checklist of *Activities* you could carry out as a Flood Warden

- Develop a Flood Plan for your community. Templates available on GOV.uk (see reverse of this sheet for links to resources, guides and templates).
- Develop warden action card(s). These should be 1 sheet of A4 – a grab sheet for each warden as a reference for what actions they need to take, a map and contact details (sample and templates available from Environment Agency, email: floodwessex@environment-agency.gov.uk)
- Identify and include actions specific for your area/community. (Several of the points below can be included in the Action Card).
- Get to know your area/community and identify the areas at risk of flooding. Understand from your Action Card WHEN and WHERE you will take actions.
- Distribute information to raise flood awareness within the community and promote property flood resilience measures.
- Encourage residents to check their flood risk and sign up to receive flood warnings. For queries please contact the Environment Agency at floodwessex@environment-agency.gov.uk
- Identify properties of potentially vulnerable residents.
- Identify the hazards in your community, eg the location of drains, manholes, ditches, kerbs, wells. Locate them on a map with a nearby house number or lamp post number.
- Compile a list of people who would be happy to volunteer during a flood and any equipment that could be used.
- Monitor the state of the watercourses within your community.
- If there is a community resilience store in your locality and who to contact about stock if it is depleted.
- Recruit extra wardens as necessary.
