Roadside Verges

A big bugbear for many of the Town's residents is the condition of the grass verges. Verges are the responsibility of Dorset Council and not the Town Council. It is an important fact that roadside verges are havens for biodiversity and wildlife. It is Dorset Council's policy to maintain the verges so that they are safe for road users but also encourage biodiversity and pollinators. This is why the verges look overgrown or only partly mowed around the edges. We acknowledge that this has mixed views across our residents.

The Town Council is an avid supporter of practices to aid wildlife and cut emissions. However, we do endeavour to inform Dorset Council of our residents opinions and to report areas where it is becoming unsafe for road users.

Redwood Road Play Area Improvements - Update

The Town Council has invited play equipment companies to submit proposals and designs for an updated play area at Redwood Road. The Council's specification was based on the feedback from the public consultation in October 2023. Two companies have submitted exciting proposals and a public consultation will take place soon to establish what people think of the designs such as what bits they like, what they don't like as much and what they would change.
