A NEW LOOK FOR RECREATION GROUND TOILETS

We're pleased to report that the refurbishment of the public toilets at Upton Recreation Ground is now complete. They have been improved significantly with all new fixtures and fittings making them a more inviting public convenience for the users of the Recreation Ground.



One is an accessible facility with a baby changing unit. In support of global water, sanitation and hygiene programmes, the toilets will be twinned with a toilet oversees which will teach communities about hygiene and supply sustainable resources for families to build their own toilets.

LOCAL ELECTIONS 2 MAY 2024

The next planned elections for Dorset Council, town and parish councils in the Dorset Council area and the Dorset Police and Crime Commissioner will take place on 2nd May 2024. This includes the elections for the whole of Lytchett Minster and Upton Town Council when, if elected, 15 councillors will serve a five year term. To be able to vote your name must be on the electoral register. If you're planning on voting at a polling station, you will need to show photo ID.
