HELP SAVE LOCAL HEDGEHOGS

Hedgehog 'highway' entrances are now available to purchase from the Town Council office for £5 (cash payments only).

One of the main reasons why hedgehogs are declining in Britain is because our fences and walls are becoming more and more secure, reducing the amount of land available to them. We can make their life easier by removing the barriers within our control - for example, by making holes in or under our garden fences for them to pass through.



DO YOU KNOW THE LOCATION OF YOUR NEAREST DEFIBRILATOR?

A defibrillator it is an essential part in trying to save the life of someone who is in cardiac arrest. If you call the emergency services and provide your location, the operator should be able to tell you where your nearest defibrillator is, if there's one in reach and give you the code to access it. That's only if they've been informed about its location though.
